urday which he won't be attending now. Anyone else would be free to use his name. It's a great show with lots of cars. Last year he was the only Corvair which gathered lots of attention. Chris said that his company van that was stollen last month was found. Apparently, it was just taken for a joyride. No estimate of what or if any damage occurred. He said the San Ramon police have cameras everywhere. They told him the van was seen at 3 in the morning going down Bollinger Canyon road the day after it was reported stolen. Josh said we had a member, Rafael, who had his Corsa stollen. It was found wrapped around a telephone pole. Ouch! Seth said it was worth putting some kind of defeat mechanism to deter joy riders (you can't stop a determined thief). Chris said what about using an Apple Tag? They are cheap (Don said 4 for \$100) and they will let you know the location of the car as long as they are near an iPhone. Fortunately, these are very common these days. Seth said if your car is stolen and you find where it is, don't go to get it. Call the police. A car is not worth dying for! Chris said the Oakland police will not chase a stollen car. Josh said this was pretty much universal these days. Craig said his car has a defeat switch in the trunk. Flipped one way, the horn sounds when the ignition is turned on, switched the other way and it runs normally. Ray said his car has a kill switch for the fuel pump which accomplishes the same thing. Josh suggests just pulling the coil wire! Seth said he has made a couple of fake coil wires for people in the past and said that, surprisingly, if you just use a rubber tubing with boots on both ends, the car will still run! He had to use solid material.

Vince Petrie joined us this evening. He is a member of Central Coast Coras as well as SFBA. As you know Central Coast Corsa is hosting the 2025 Convention that will be held in Santa Maria, CA. They are in the process of establishing the various committees for all the planned events and they are looking for volunteers. This will be a 5-day event with the usual activities, auto-cross, econo-run, rally, value cover races, model car show, etc. They have locked in a \$119/night rate at the host hotel (Radison Hotel Santa Maria). Carl said this sounds like a very good rate to him even considering the exchange rate (1.5: 1). Plus it's a shorter flight! Carl said he will be giving a presentation at this year's Convention and can do the same at the Santa Maria event if that would help. Vince will make a note of this.

Christy said he has received the venturi unit for his Nash Fan but doesn't know how to install it. It came with no instructions. The unit has cut-outs for the fan belt but no apparent accommodations for the throttle crossover linkage. Josh said he will contact Kevin Nash to find the answers. Carl said he has a Nash Fan but didn't get the venturi because his car has air conditioning, and the condenser fits right over the fan. Seth asked Christy how the Nash Fan worked on the trip to Detroit? Christy said it performed better than expected! Head temperatures were about 300F at 55 mph on a flat road and it was 380F with the stock fan. Going up a hill in low gear (3500 rpm) the temperatures reached 395F. His Ultravan has the lower shrouds so they can open giving maximum air flow. On his trip East he got 15 mpg! A bit less on the return because of a headwind. Carl said by the time he got his Nash Fan there was not much change back from \$3000

Joe said he has been hearing a noise from the engine for a few weeks. It started getting pretty loud and he found that the fuel pump was vibrating. When he put his hand on the pump the noise went away. Turns out the locking pin and the lock nut had come loose. Joe thinks now is a good time to put on the "kit" (Arizona Dave's kit with gauge and adjustable fuel flow). He is hoping it won't affect the carbs. Seth said he also had the kit also but hasn't used it yet. It probably won't have any effect on the carbs at all.

Seth said that Valley Corsa provides Corvair convertibles for the Wilcox High School Home Coming parade to escort the dignitaries. They usually have 4 or 5 Corvairs. This year one of the Corvairs was involved in a minor accident on the way to the parade. No real damage. But after exchanging insurance info, he only went a few more miles and the car started smoking badly. He had an engine fire! He pulled over and others also stopped to help and they put the fire out. Seth did not know how much damage occurred. But Seth indicated that if you carry a fire extinguisher be sure it is easily accessible. He suggested keeping it between the front seats on a late model. Whatever you do don't keep it in the engine compartment. Don mentioned that you can get a dry extinguisher stick that goes in the engine compartment (you attach it to the inside of the rear deck lid). It goes off when an engine fire is sensed. Seth said these were worth a look. Don said they were not too expensive (maybe \$200) and they provide 1 to 2 minutes of extinguishing compared to 30 seconds for a normal 10 lb Co2



extinguisher. Craig mentioned that there are fire blankets available. Carl said that when he first starts his Corvair he will have 3 fire extinguishers available just in case! Christy said to be sure to aim at the base of the flames to choke off the Oxygen supply and not at the flames themselves. Seth and Craig both said they had had fire extinguisher training and you would be surprised how fast the extinguishers empty, especially with the Adrenaline flowing! So be judicious when applying the retardant. **Swap & Sell:** Nothing specifically mentioned.

Meeting adjourned about 8:11 PM.

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
