etc.). He said you could be there a month and not see everything. Truly over whelming.

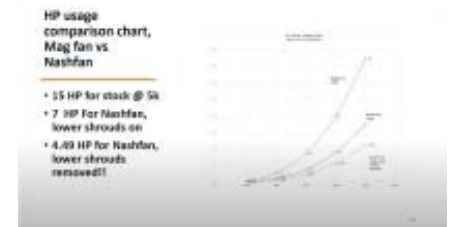
Herb mentioned that when he goes to car shows, he tends to go past the perfect restorations and head toward the "drivers". He finds those most interesting. He added that the military used Corvair motors in lots of ground transport equipment.

Alex (a guest tonight) said he acquired a '65 Monza convertible that has been in the family for many years. He wants to get it fixed and running so his wife can drive it. He asked about mechanics and Josh mentioned Mell, Dave and Zacki. Dave may be the closest. He has restored many muscle cars in the past (GTOs, Road Runners, etc.) but he knows nothing about Corvairs. It sounds like it's complete but who knows the condition after sitting for 15+ years. It was suggested he contact David Gray to see if he can access where he stands, what has to be done, and what he may need to get. The car is probably a 110/Automatic but Alex wasn't sure. Carl mentioned that many people seem to first acquire a car and then join a club. To him it made more sense to join a club first and afterwards acquire a car, possibly one from another member. That way you would know what you are getting into. Alex was wondering about an electric conversion. There is a place in So Cal that does this. Josh said that yes there was but it was quite expensive. Clark sug-

gested contacting SFBA member Keven Hightower who has done this on his early Corvair (see Spyder Web, February 2022). Alex asked about tires, Josh said that stock 13" (185-R13) were available from Maxxis or from Coker (more stock looking but more expensive). Paul said he purchased some from Simpletire.com, less than \$100 each and likes them. They came with free shipping and a local tire shop mounted them on his rims.

Craig said the driver's door is still frozen shut. He finally got the passenger's side open but has had no luck in opening the other. He asked if anyone has any ideas? Maybe he could locate another door so he could closely examine how the mechanism worked and what could possibly be hanging up. With the door closed access to the lock is very limited. It was suggested he squirt the daylights out of the lock assembly in the hopes that some oil would penetrate to where it was needed. Several people indicated that they had heard of doors frozen shut before, but never this tightly. Usually, a good shove or kick from the inside was all that was needed. Craig asked how many had seen the CORSA's Nash Fan video. Many said they had and were impressed with the engineering and science that went into the design of the fan. It not only looks cool but is much more efficient. One chart showed where the stock magnesium fan consumed 15 hp at 5000

rpm, the Nash Fan with its more efficient design only used 7 hp!



Jeffrey said he lost a rear axle on his Raffle Car. He has taken the car to Mell to have him fix it and check it more thoroughly. He gets it back shortly. This is the third time he has had it towed in the few months he has had it!

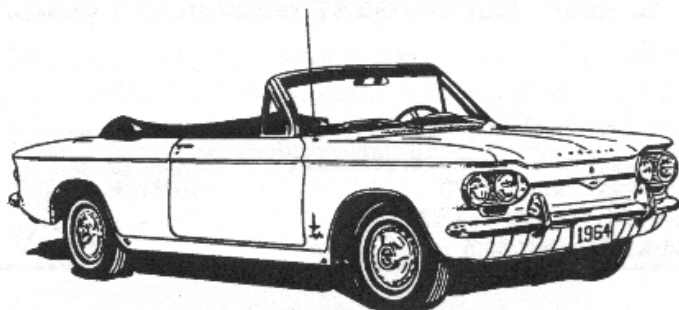
Hayden indicated he was interested in an EFI conversion for his Corvair. There are several vendors that sell components. Jeffrey suggested Mell could install it. Hayden said his car idles at around 2000 when cold and 1200 when hot. That seems quite high. Maybe 1500/700 might be better (and quieter).

Swap & Sell: Craig said someone in Cool, CA (a town East of Auburn on Hwy 49) has lots of Corvairs and part that must go. And soon! The owner must get his property cleared for an upcoming fire inspection. I think Josh has more details and contact info.

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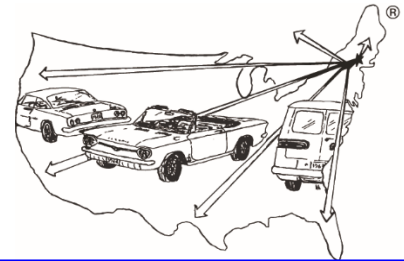

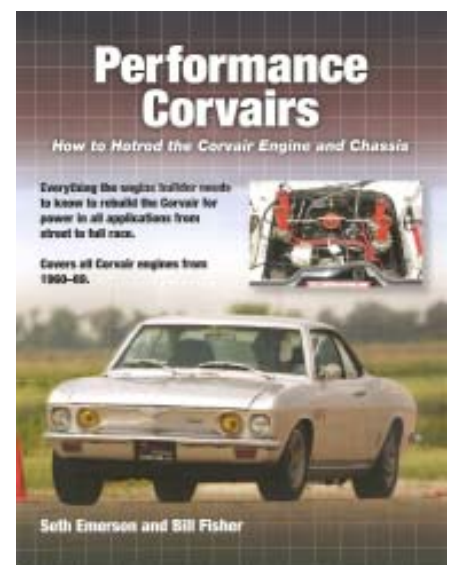
