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# Minutes of the Last Meeting

Dec 7, 2023

Josh got the regular meeting started around 7:00 PM following a short Board meeting. When the room was opened, Josh, Harry, Ray and I were quickly joined by Herb, Carl, Seth, Don, Chris, Christy, Lane, Jeffrey, Paul, and newer member Peter Tachis. I hope I included everyone.

Treasury Report: The bank balance as reported in the last newsletter is \$4,538.54. Herb mentioned that the Club's finances have been holding steady lately. We use to be flirting with the \$3000 minimum B-of-A required. Our income now pretty much covers our expenses (newsletters and events) since the dues were raised from \$20/ yr to \$25/yr. Clark said our current balance was primarily due to two gifts the Club has received. One was from Harry Exline in Danville who left us 3643.68 after taxes and the other from Lu Goni's car that was left to the Club which was sold for \$1000. Prior to these donations the balance was well under \$1000. Truly we have our members to thank for the state we are in!

**Membership:** Josh did not report any new members this month although a few have expressed interest.

**Old Business:** Nothing mentioned.

New Business: This year's Holiday Dinner (or Luncheon) is set for The Grill At Blackhawk. Clark made reservations for us at 11:30 AM. And there will be cake! Joe has made the Blackhawk Museum reservations for us at 2:00 PM and we are able to park our Corvairs right in front of the Museum. The car club group rate is \$10/each. The latest count is 18 for

lunch, 20 for the tour, and 5 Corvairs. This should be a great day!

Events: Herb mentioned that since he has been an SFBA member (over 40 years) there have been more Club events in the last two years than he can remember. He credits Zoom for bringing more Club members together (witness by Christy from Grass Valley, Herb from Winters, and Carl from Australia!). Josh agreed having more people attending the meetings, even if they are far away, gives us more incentive to enjoy our Corvairs.

**Tech:** Herb said before he retired, he use to drive his '64 Convertible to work in Richmond. Then one day he had to work in San Ramon and he didn't have a covered parking space and it was raining heavily. When he went to leave there was an inch of water on the carpets! Made for a sloshy drive. When he finally got home he took the carpets out and drained the water through holes in the floorboards. That's the last time he has driven his Corvair in the rain. Nowadays it is becoming very rare to see a Corvair on the highway just being driven. Harry said when he drove his convertible to Antioch (when we met at the Riverview restaurant) it was a rainy day and when turned the wipers off as the weather cleared, they kept going, slowly) for a couple of minutes. Seth said that the wipers continue as long as there is a ground (that's how they "park"). So maybe the wet wires provided so sort of grounding path. Herb said on his '36 Chevy it has vacuum powered wipers. When you go uphill they almost stop, but go like crazy on downhills!

Peter Tachis, a new member, joined us this evening. Peter does not have a Corvair but is looking for a late model, 4 sp, coupe that he can drive around. He wanted tips on what to look for and where to shop. Boy did he come to the right place! Seth mentioned that the Corvair Basics book (this is free with new CORSA memberships) has a chapter om how to buy a used Corvair. What to look for and what to look out for. Jeffrey said that before he bought his "project" car he looked at several Corvairs and the book was very helpful. He rejected 3 possibilities by following the advice in the book. His current project car was in the process of being restored but the owner had to quit. The body was in great shape but there was no interior and the engine and suspension had not been touched. These were things he felt he could do. He suggested going to look at a few Corvairs, without intending to purchase, just to see how to apply the check list. Seth suggested that he look for a car that needs the work that he can do. Don said to come to the Luncheon, and you will see a number of nice Corvairs. But Peter will be out of town in Denver. Josh said to check into Steve Goodman (Rear Engine Specialists – Golden, CO). He can provide lots of helpful information and he is nice to deal with. Carl said in his opinion you should "buy the best you can afford". This will be cheaper in the long run. Others said to get a car that looks good and doesn't need major body work (paint is very expensive these days) even if it doesn't run as all this you can do yourself. Peter said he saw a '65 Turbo on Craig's list) in Napa

for \$4k. Josh said he has seen this but doubts it's real. He thinks he knows every Corvair in Napa and this price isn't right. Peter wondered if \$5k or \$6k was reasonable for a Corvair that needed "a little work". Don said it depends on what a "little work" means. For that price it probably won't have nice paint. Carl said from what he has seen classic cars either have been restored or need a lot of work. It's rare to find anything in between. And since these are old cars, they all will need work to keep drivable. Peter asked where he should be looking. Herb mentioned Hemmings, Don said he used eBay Motors and Paul said to check the Club's newsletter. Lane said to check into Corvair Marketplace, they had a nice-looking late model for \$13k. Josh said to send in his requirements to Clark and he can put that in the newsletter. Peter asked if any one year was better than the others. Seth said he preferred '65s because the transmissions shifted easier. In '66 and later Chevy used stronger transmissions (preferred by racers) but were harder to shift. Also '67 and later had more safety features like dual master cylinders, and collapsable steering wheel but the seats were not as comfortable. Seth stressed

that for pre '67s you should add a dual master cylinder. Not a difficult procedure and nwell worth it! Peter also asked about decoding the VIN numbers. Seth said there are a couple of sites online that can do both the body tags and the VIN numbers. Peter asked if Mike's Corvair was a good source. Seth said he deals mainly in parts, not cars. Josh said he was a good source for parts. Maybe not as quick as Clark's but a bit cheaper. Jeffrey said Mel always had lots of Corvairs around his shop and is a great source of Corvair knowledge. Peter asked if there were any Corvair junkyards? Seth said "Yes, but not around here". There is Corvair Ranch in PA for instance. Josh said that Steve Morton, in Nampa, ID had lots of Corvair stuff (body panels, glass, etc.). He runs Morton Classic Garage. He comes down here periodically. A few months ago, someone in Brentwood had lots of Corvair parts and needed to get rid of them fast. Steve drove down and took the whole lot.

Seth said he received a call from Bill Borland's son. Bill was a long time SFBA member that passed away a few years ago. We use too see Bill at our Holiday Dinners when we had them at Harry's Hofbrau in San Leandro. His son said most of the Corvairs are gone but he still had lots of parts. Most notably he has a '69 140 crate motor (still in the crate). Talk about a rare find. "Don't tell Bruce!"






