Minutes of the Last Meeting

Feb 1, 2024

Josh got the regular meeting started around 7:00 PM following a short Board meeting. When the room was opened, Josh and I were quickly joined by Ray, Harry, Carl, Seth, Chris, Bruce, Christy, Jeffrey, Peter, Don, Paul, and Lane. I hope I included everyone. Josh indicated he would have to bow out early this evening, work has been crazy and he is exhausted. Ray, Clark, and Seth will take over.

Treasury Report: Harry reported the bank balance stood at \$4385.30.

Membership: Josh did not report any new members this month although a few have expressed interest. Remember SFBA Corsa dues for 2024 are due now.

Old Business: Nothing mentioned.

New Business: It is that time of year again, SFBA Club dues for 2024 are now due. As in the past we try to keep everyone's due date on the first of the year. This makes it easier on us to plan events. A list will be plublished in the next newsletter.

Events: Another Open House at Gabe's Sterling Restorations in Fairfield is in the planning stages. Looking at early Summer.

As the rains diminish look for Cars and Coffee events to start up again.

Tech: Seth said his business is soaring! Filling orders for his quick steering option is keeping him very busy. He

said when Flaming River stopped selling their quick steer option, he found another company that was making reverse steering Corvair boxes for street rod use. He talked them into making the regular steering boxes and at the same time offer a quick steer option. The result is a quick steering box very similar to the '65-'66 factory quick steering option. This is a direct replacement for '60-'63 models and other years need an adapter. With pent-up demand he is very busy at the moment although he doesn't expect to demand to keep up. After all he is retired and not looking for another "job". He is now working on a new item, a suspension option for late model Corvairs (performance oriented).

Chris reported that he found the mysterious reason why his Corvair was not running too well. On a pressure test cylinder #1 showed only 20 psi while others were ~120 psi. David Gray came over and pull the head and found that an exhaust stud had pulled out. The rocker arm had fallen off and there were a couple of broken rings. Besides replacing the piston, he had to replace the block as that stud had already had a insert installed. Chris had the car towed to David's shop in Vallejo (it's good to have AAA!).

Chris said he is cleaning out his garage and found lots of parts for Power Wheels that the kids no longer need. Rather than throw them away, what can he do? Bruce suggested using Google and look for a special interest group and tell them what you have. There are groups for virtually everything these days.

Bruce reported that he was looking at a Greenbriar in Southern California. It was on ebay and from the pictures it looked fantastic but not cheap (maybe \$20k).



It's near where his son lives in Huntington Beach so he put down a \$2500 deposit and flew down to check it out. The outside looked perfect. A great paint job and the interior was pristine. But looking underneath he found that this had not been touched at all! There was rust everywhere and in places he could put his finger through. And there were brackets missing or broken and not replaced correctly. Bruce felt it would take \$20k to fix this up. He told the guy that this car was not as described but the guy would not give him his deposit back. Just then the guy's wife mentioned that the banks were closing soon but Bruce felt the "Bank of Bruce" is already closed. He said he felt sorry for the person that does buy this. Carl said that he has known friends that have bought cars after only seeing pictures and had them shipped to Australia only to find they are so rusted they were worthless. Off to the crusher they go.

Bruce has been working on this Yenko Stinger. He took some suspension parts to MPC Powder Coating in Rohnert Park. What a wonderful job they did,

Picked up the front suspension components from MPC powder coating in Rohnert Park. They did an amazing job smoothing out all surfaces and gave me the best results ever on powder coating.

Check out how smooth the crossmember turned out! Check out

the factory supplied quick steering arms

Next project is to put it all back together with new Koni shocks and original hardware where possible.

While I had the front end out for powder coating and rebuild I was able to see the hidden vin. The vin matched all data plates and paperwork. Very important for a Yenko. This is the original body which is very hard to find

Check out the gas tank area - no rust anywhere in the body area. Super clean!

look at how smooth the cross member turned out! Beautiful!



He said that once the front suspension is out, replacing the gas tank is an easy, five minute job! He thought when replacing the tank, it would probably be easier and quicker to drop the front suspension first. Seth said that this works only on West Coast cars. On Eastern cars the suspension bolts are so rusted they are very difficult to remove. Out here we have it easy. Bruce said on a D.C. car once the license plate has been on for a few months, it will never come off!

Bruce said that Eric's car is nearly done over at Gabe's. He is ready to start installing the many Sprint options he has been collecting (many still in original wrappers). He has the Hands wheels,



(see above) and the shifter, and badges. Bruce said he was looking for a particular seat belt for his '65 and Eric found him a brand new, still in the box, Saddle color belt. Perfect! How does he do it?

Bruce said he is looking for some parts for his '69 that Bill Borland's son may know of. Seth said he would forward the contact info to Bruce.

Bruice said he was having trouble in getting the glove box to open and close correctly on his '69. When he took it off he marked the screw holes so he could reassemble it the same way. But it didn't open properly and he is having trouble getting one screw off (he over-tightened it). He will have to cut a hole in the box to get it apart. He has another box from Clark's. Another issue is the wiring. When he puts the car in reverse, the GEN light comes on. Also the right turn signal does not flash. The left turn signal works properly and all of the exterior lights work and show up brightly. Seth said, regarding the GEN light, put the car in reverse and unplug the wires going to the trans and see which one (or both) have power. Then look at the wiring diagram to see how this wire could be getting power. The turn signal is different, Bruce said all three lights (right front, right rear, right dash) come on brightly but do not flash. Seth and Carl suggested to try another flasher. Chris said there is a flasher made for LED lights that does not rely on amperage to flash. (Editor's note: It just occurred to me to remove the flasher entirely and see if the right turn signal lights still come on? This would indicate that the right turn signal is getting power from some source other than the flasher. Maybe it's a steering harness wiring issue. Possibly the horn and right signal lines are reversed?).

Jeffrey said he took his Corvair to Mel's hoping to track down the noise he has been hearing for months now. And, of course, down at Mel's it made no noise. He will try again ion a couple

of weeks. Jeffrey inquired about a Nash fan. He was told that he just missed an order but they always order one more fan than necessary in case one does not come out as expected. Jeffrey is hoping he will be able get one from this batch. This will be about \$1900 with the color and options he wanted. Carl said that's a bargain. He paid \$3k (AUD). But it is a very high quality product and worth it. Jeffrey is thinking of a Gold color to contrast the Black sheet metal. Should look fantastic. Bruce said he saw one that was Copper colored and had Copper fuel and oil lines. Looked crazy.

Peter said he was still looking for a Corvair. He was interested in one in Southern California (Beverly Hills Car Club). Bruce said "No!", definitely stay away from that. Bruce suggested he talk with Eric. He might have reached his limit and may be willing to part with one. He has several very nice Ciorvairs. Seth said he might have one for Peter, they will talk. Chris said that David Gray had Corvairs he would like to sell. Peter did go down to Mel's and talked with him and came away with lots of ideas.

Carl said that he and his wife came down with COVID. It has had him laid up for some time and he has not been able to work on his Corvair much. But by next meeting he will report on how well it runs. Clark said how about calling in from his garage that way we will be able to see and hear it start up. Good idea, he will try that!

Carl said when he changed the coil on his '69 he, somehow, wired it in reverse. He has since fixed this but wondered if it would still have enough voltage to start the engine? Clark said he didn't

think the coil was polarized as such and might work either way. But the points may wear differently. Seth said it would be easy to find out, with the ignition "on" pull the center coil wire and hold it close to ground. Now ground the negative side of the coil and you should see a spark.


